The city had already been working on a backup well, so we were ahead of the game there, now it was speeding up the completion process. I must say a huge thank you to Raymond Forshee, Sandy Warncke and Brad Slusher for pulling together to make sure the city did not run out of water. Raymond Forshee went to Piedmont and Ironton several times a day to fill a water tanker to keep our water tank filled. That was a lot of time and effort on his part, and we are

so ever thankful for everything he does for this city. Sandy May had just as important a role during this crucial time. Sandy did all her normal job tasks and kept up with all the communication at all levels regarding the water problem, communication and meetings were a huge part of this process. There was no way for all involved to do their jobs and the community not to run out of water without these two people, God has blessed us with them.

Raymond and Brad were able to restore the well that went down to partial capacity and we are progressing on the new well. There were a lot of government processes to that we had to meet and qualify for, which we did. Also, would like to thank SGI for helping fund the new well that will keep water flowing to the city.
